KCACTF Region 7 Speaker February 18, 2020 – Fort Collins, Colorado

- Held a workshop "Who Am I?: Creating a Character through Movement, Vocals, and the Page"
- During this workshop I guided students in creating characters through various research, movement, and the voice. We explored Laban Movement and how the body changes due to a character's situation, history, and their environment. I also walked them through how the

voice changes as the body shifts and how to use the voice properly without pushing. Finally, we talked about different research students can do to make sure they create a complete character with all of the information they need to react easily and truthfully as their character. At the end, students asked questions about how to tackle difficult characters and situations and we worked through how to work through any issues.

Instructor - ACM 255: Film and Digital Media Fall 2019 - University of Hawai'i at Mānoa

- Created a syllabus that fit the Academy for Creative Media's criteria
- ACM 255 An in-depth study of the process and art of filmmaking. In this class, we watched, discussed, analyzed, read, and wrote about films with a critical eye to understanding cinematic storytelling and its various elements such as mise-en-scene, cinematography, editing, and sound. We examined the origins and history of film to see how it has developed and become a part of so many societies. We learned about the filmmaking process, from idea to finished film. Students were exposed to and became familiar with cinema vocabulary. By watching media carefully, analyzing, discussing and writing about it, students developed their critical abilities. The ultimate goal was for students to gain a deeper understanding and appreciation for the art form.

Instructor - THEA 220: Voice and Movement Fall 2018 - University of Hawai'i at Mānoa

 THEA 220 - An introduction to the basic fundamentals of voice and movement for the actor. Students concentrated on breathing and relaxation exercises, neutral mask, and other approaches to increase self-awareness and potential for self-expression. The work in this class was preparatory for a wide range of acting/movement/vocal techniques. Classes began with exercises to help identify and release tensions that were preventing the voice and physical instrument from being their most expressive. Resonance, range, projection, and articulation were further explored to add depth and professional maturity to the voice. In movement, Laban Movement Analysis was introduced to identify personal tendencies in relation to time, weight, focus, and space and become a springboard for character analysis. We also utilized other exercises and techniques from Linklater, Alexander, Fitzmaurice, and several others. Students had ample opportunity to practice techniques on poems, monologues and other theatrical material.
